Science week

This week, throughout the school we have been focusing on STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering & Maths) activities within the theme of time. The children have explored how to create and read time in various ways from making paper clocks, to sand timers, the use of a pendulum as well as using the power of water. We have considered how time has been charted through light and shadows; creating puppets in KS1. In KS2 the children took part in a live science lesson online where they explored how things change over time looking at the life cycles of mini beasts. On Wednesday all of the children explored time through looking at the stars directly above our school in a mobile Planetarium. We also considered the impact of time on our environment, looking at alternative ways to farm and make materials including biodegradable plastic. Year 3 even did some planting considering the changes in season over time. On Friday we rounded the week off by dressing up as STEM members, including scientists from the past, and showcased our amazing inventive future ideas.
