Oasis academy
:coulsdon is now a fully-inclusive, **Science & Technology with Business & Enterprise specialist Academy**, catering for students aged 11-16. The Sixth Form will open in September 2011. Oasis is undergoing a significant refurbishment programme over the next couple of years.

Sixteen local student leaders drew inspiration from Westminster recently before helping draw up a slice of education policy for their own Academy.

Following a tour of the Houses of Parliament, bumping into Lord Alan Sugar in the lobby and watching the leader of the House of Commons take his seat, students contributed to a document that will set the agenda for how Academies are shaped in the future.

The students, also met one of their local MP's Richard Ottaway at Westminster Central Hall after being led round the Houses of Parliament on tours provided for them by their host, Joan Ryan, Labour MP for Enfield North. Mr Ottaway commented "I was delighted to meet bright vibrant young people who are part of a success story."

One student commented, "The Houses of Parliament really do have the X factor. It made us realise what heritage we have and how we can aspire to greater things for ourselves. We have the potential to have the butterfly impact and we will aim to bring change for the benefit of everyone in and around our Academy."

Past CWEST Projects

Last Easter some of our children took part in a **Media Medley project hosted by Crystal Palace Study Support Centre**. The children were taught how to use Apple Mac technology to create movies and story boards and were treated to a tour of the stadium and given family tickets to a match.

Also over the Easter holidays **Woodcote High School** offered a very popular **drama workshop**.



Our **CWEST Summer Scheme, UR Special**, took place over three weeks of the summer holidays. The children enjoyed performing arts, photography and music and parents joined the children to make smoothies and pizzas, enjoy some massage, showcases and hear inspirational speakers. Family Learning Week took place in October and we hosted two family fun events at Rotary Field, Purley and Grange Park, Coulsdon. Activities included t. shirt making, clay model making, various giant games, inflatable football and slides.

Following on from **Woodcote Primary's** successful after school **family cookery** course they bravely hosted twenty four families for a larger event. The hall was filled with families making fruit kebabs together. A parent commented *"This is great. Well organised and fun. Children had a great time and nice it was school based"*.

Both the libraries and the children's centres offered a variety of activities including local story telling sessions, circus games and lots of craft activities.
