## **School Uniform Policy**

### **1 Introduction**

1.1 It is our school policy that all children wear school uniform when attending school, or when participating in a school-organised event outside normal school hours. We provide a complete list of the items stipulated as school uniform (see Appendix A) in our school prospectus.

### **2 Aims and objectives**

2.1 Our policy on school uniform is based on the belief that school uniform: promotes a sense of pride in the school; engenders a sense of community and belonging towards the school; is practical and smart; identifies the children with the school; prevents children from coming to school in fashion clothes that could be distracting in class; makes children feel equal to their peers in terms of appearance; is regarded as suitable wear for school and good value for money by most parents; is designed with health and safety in mind.

### **3 Jewellery**

3.1 On health and safety grounds we do not allow children to wear jewellery or make-up including nail varnish in our school. The exceptions to this rule are small plain gold or silver earring studs in pierced ears, small objects of religious significance, such as a crucifix on a chain, and small analogue watches from Year 2. We ask the children to remove these objects during PE and games to prevent them from causing injury. We recommend that ear piercing takes place at the beginning of the summer holidays to allow for healing and the safe removal of earrings for P.E.

### **4 Extreme haircuts**

4.1 The school does not permit children to have 'extreme' haircuts that could serve as a distraction to other children. These may include hairstyles which are too short or with designs cut into the hair, 'Mohicans', colours, shaved heads etc. A child with a hairstyle deemed by the Headteacher to be in contravention of the school uniform policy may be sent home at the Headteacher's discretion.

### **5 Footwear and Coats**

5.1 We require all children to wear shoes as stated in the uniform list. All shoes must have a secure fastening, ie laces, straps, Velcro or buckle fastening. Children are not permitted to wear trainers or boots to school. We believe that it is dangerous for children to wear shoes that have platform soles, high heels or open toed, so we do not allow children to wear such shoes in our school.

5.2 We require all children to have a rain jacket or similar in school at all times due to our very changeable weather

### **6 The role of parents**

6.1 We ask all parents who send their children to our school to support the school uniform policy. We believe that parents have a duty to send their children to school correctly

dressed and ready for their daily schoolwork. One of the responsibilities of parents is to ensure that their child has the correct uniform, and that it is clean and in good repair.

6.2 If any parent would like the school to modify the uniform policy, they should make representation, in the first instance, to the Headteacher. The school welcomes children from all backgrounds and faith communities. If there are serious reasons, for example on religious grounds, why parents want their child to wear clothes that differ from the school uniform, the school will look sympathetically at such requests.

## **7 The role of governors**

7.1 The governing body supports the Headteacher in implementing the school uniform policy. It considers all representations from parents regarding the uniform policy and liaises with the Headteacher to ensure that the policy is implemented fairly and with sensitivity.

7.2 It is the governors' responsibility to ensure that the school uniform meets all regulations concerning equal opportunities.

7.3 Governors ensure that the school uniform policy helps children to dress sensibly, in clothing that is hardwearing, safe and practical.

## **8 Contravention of the school uniform policy**

8.1 Should a child attend school wearing items that are not in keeping with the school uniform policy, a note will be sent home to parents to ask them to comply with the policy, or to invite them to discuss the matter with the Headteacher or Deputy Headteacher.

If you are unable to comply with this policy for financial reasons then please discuss this with the School Office or Headteacher. Nearly new school uniform is available for all families.

In the case of earrings or jewellery, the item may be confiscated and retained in the School Office until it is collected by a parent or carer.

## **9 Monitoring and review**

9.1 The governing body monitors and reviews the school uniform policy through its committee work by:

- seeking the views of parents, to ensure that they agree with and support the policy; considering, with the Headteacher, any requests from parents for individual children to have special dispensation with regard to school uniform; requiring the Headteacher to report to the governors on the way the school uniform policy is implemented.

## **Appendix A**

### **Compulsory School Uniform**

#### **Infant Boys**

- Grey trousers/shorts
- White polo shirt
- Green or red Coulsdon C of E School jumper\* with school logo
- Black shoes, plain grey socks

#### **Infant Girls**

- Green pinafore dress (winter); red or green checked dress (summer)
- White polo shirt
- Green or red Coulsdon C of E School jumper/cardigan\* with school logo
- White socks (summer); green/red tights (winter)
- Black shoes
- (regulation grey trousers may also be worn in the winter)

#### **Junior Boys**

- Grey trousers/shorts
- White shirt, school tie\*\* - (summer: polo shirt - optional)
- Green or red Coulsdon C of E school jumper\* with school logo
- Black shoes, plain grey socks

#### **Junior Girls**

- Green skirt (winter); red or green checked dress (summer)
- White shirt, school tie\*\*, reverse collar blouse (summer: polo shirt - optional)
- Green or red Coulsdon C of E school jumper/cardigan\* with school logo
- White socks/green tights [Y6 only – Black tights (winter only)]
- Black shoes
- Regulation grey trousers may also be worn in the winter

#### **Outdoor wear: either:**

- Dark coloured coat in either red, dark green, navy, black or brown. Red or green showerproof fleece/anoraks are available from the school uniform shop\*
- Summer hats\*
- Winter hats\*, scarves & gloves
- Rain jacket/kagool for warmer days

#### **PE Kit**

- School PE Sweatshirt \*
- Red shorts\* and white T-shirts\*
- Green black or navy sports tracksuit (for outdoor games)
- Plimsolls (trainers for some junior games activities)

#### **Book Bags**

- Red book bag with school logo (available in school only)
- or School backpack with school logo\* (Juniors only)

#### **Hairstyles**

Hair worn longer than the base of the neckline should be tied back- small hair accessories should be red, green, black or brown.

No 'extreme' haircuts or designs cut into the hair (see full School Uniform Policy).

#### **Jewellery**

No makeup or jewellery to be worn at school with the exception of small plain gold or silver earring studs in pierced ears and small objects of religious significance.

Small analogue watches from Year 2
