Firework safety reminders

Over the next couple of weeks, many of our children and families may be attending fireworks displays. Fireworks are exciting, but they can be very dangerous and can hurt you. At Friday’s assembly the children came up with some top tips for how to stay safe with fireworks. Here are some reminders to share with your children

- Listen to your grown-up about where there is a safe place to stand.
- Never touch a firework. Don’t pick up a firework after it has been used.
- If possible wear your gloves when you hold your sparkler and keep it away from your body.
- Keep your sparkler safely away from other people and don’t run around with it.
- Leave your dressing up clothes at home on fireworks night, wrap up warm instead.
- Stand well away from the bonfire and stay close to the grown-ups.
