


What an exciting start to the year it has been!

<u> September – Roald Dahl</u>

Roald Dahl was a novelist, short-story writer, fighter pilot and screen writer. He was born in Wales on 13 September 1916 to Norwegian parents.

During World War II, Dahl became a Wing Commander and intelligence agent before becoming a writer in the 1940s. Since then, Dahl has become one of the most famous and popular children's authors of all time with many of his books being made into films and theatre productions.

Some of his most famous works are: Charlie and the Chocolate Factory, The Witches, Matilda, James and the Giant Peach, The BFG and The Twits.

On 13 September, Mr Twit came to visit us here at Coulsdon and shared some excerpts from his story with all of the children. Great fun was had by all!

<u> October – Baroness Floella Benjamin</u>

Baroness Floella Benjamin has been famous for many years, appearing in both films and television since the 1970s and working as an actress in the West End. She is perhaps most well-known for her time presenting Play School on the BBC.

Her book Coming to England has been our book for October which is about her journey to England from Trinidad. Mrs Lambe has enjoyed sharing this story with classes across the school during the past month and the children have enjoyed learning about it as part of their class reading sessions.

During her life, Baroness Benjamin has also carried out a wide range of charitable works protecting and supporting the health and wellbeing of children. Owing to her charitable works, she became a Dame. She was also given the role of carrying the Sceptre with Dove at the coronation of King Charles III and Queen Camilla.















