Class Expectations

- We will be continuing with the school theme of Brilliant Learning Behaviour and working on our Growth Mindset (changing our attitude to learning) and wellbeing
- Our Ethos- We are preparing your children to be ready for secondary school. We are helping them to become the best individuals that they can. We want them to transition into year 7 as seamlessly as possible. We want them to enjoy their last year at this school and make as many memories as possible!
- <u>SAT's-</u> We have to do them but they won't define the children. We will prepare the children for them and all the work will be carried out in line with them... We will do everything we can to ensure they are as confident in what they are doing, as they can be. However, we will not be making it the sole focus of our year, we do not want to put the children under any unnecessary stress.
- Working atmosphere: In line with secondary schools
- Rewards: Golden time on Friday- 10 minutes
- <u>Sanctions</u>: Deduction of golden time minutes. Traffic light verbal warning, amber note home in planner to be signed, red restorative meeting, copy of which will be attached in planner to be signed.

- Provides an outlet to be reflective
- · An important focus within the curriculum this year



Support your child

- Encourage them to undertake TTRockstars homework- times tables are vital
 to helping them through the arithmetic test
- Learn and relearn spellings- y3 and 4 spellings form a major foundation of the SATS and are just as important as the year 5 and 6 spellings
- Please DO NOT get the children to undertake any official past SATS papers from 2015 through to 2018. We use these to measure their academic levels and determine focused support
- Mental maths- Encourage them to do mental maths whenever there is a spare moment- the speed and accuracy is vital for SATS.
- Keep them reading- anything. Fiction, non-fiction. Newspapers are the best preparation.
- Encourage them to complete their homework and ask questions if they don't understand it. Their homework supports their foundation for SATS.
- Encourage them to be INDEPENDENT and complete and hand in work on time



Homework



Monday: Spellings / Handwriting - Test following Monday Numeracy - due in on Tuesday ** Literacy - due in on Tuesday**

- Collective marking Home work will be a combination of online work and paper
- Home Learning weekly or fortnightly linked in with topic, Science or RE
- Reading class reader- 10 pages daily. To be recorded in their planner and signed by an adult on a Thursday night. Alternative book to be read if it isn't their turn for class reader.
- Reading Planet- Online resource
- TTRockstars 30 minutes per week

Homework is designed to reinforce knowledge taught in the classroom and should not be a struggle! If there is a difficulty with a piece of homework, please get the children to come and chat with us **before** the deadline.

Homework may not be as differentiated as it is in lessons.

Planners <u>need</u> to be signed <u>each</u> week by parents. This is to help prepare them for being more organised for secondary school.

<u>Partnership</u>



- Parents / Children and School. This partnership is important for a child's development.
- Can you please inform me of any changes in a pupil's home environment e.g. bereavement, hospitalisation, separation, intolerances etc.
- Please use the planners to send messages to me. It is the child's responsibility to show the planner to me if a message has been written. I or a TA will initial a message when I have been shown it.
- <u>Bedtimes</u> the recommendation is that the average for a 10-year-old is 10 hours, which can vary by up to an hour either way.
- Walking Home I will need a letter or email if you are happy for your child to walk home. A separate letter is required if you are happy for your child to walk home after a club.
- Mobile Phones Are only allowed if a child is walking home on their own or without an adult from school. A form needs to be signed and the phone is kept in a locked drawer in the classroom
- · Walking to school- Government guidelines-No more than 6 children
